his has been a very busy time at the workshop. Two instruments have been shipped since spring and work on a third organ is well underway. Opus 124 for Christ Episcopal Church in Roanoke, Virginia, delivered in April, is

now complete and is reported to be a stunning installation, both visually and musically. The organ will be dedicated during the Sunday morning liturgy on November 14. In the spring Tom Baugh, the Director of Music, will play two Inaugural Recitals and James Litton will conduct a Choral Festival in May. Please see the calendar for dates and times.

Opus 123 for Saint Chrysostom's Church in Chicago was delivered in September and the installation is progressing well. Voicing began in October and is scheduled for completion in time for Daniel Roth's recital February 27.

In the workshop we are working on Opus 126, a three-manual organ of fifty-two stops for St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Greenville, North Carolina. Large portions of the case are being assembled in several corners of the shop and it is scheduled to be shipped this winter. Janette Fishell, the Organist and Music Director, visited the shop recently to review details of the case design, console arrangement, schedule, and voicing.

In May the instrument for Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church, our Opus 122, was dedicated with a recital played by Layton James, keyboardist for the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra, and a cameo appearance by Lili Ardalan, a local high school student. Ms. Ardalan's playing has already won her several awards and the notice of Minnesota Public Radio's *Pipedreams*. We will be watching for her name!

This year marks the anniversaries of a number of our important instruments. Opus 44 at King's Chapel, Boston, celebrates its 40th anniversary. Heinrich Christensen's new CD will be released in honor of the

occasion and he will play a concert on November 28, with selections from the original Organ Dedication as well as the world premiere of "A Flourish, a Vision and a Commandment" by Daniel Pinkham. Dan will also speak about the history of the organ project.

ALL THE STOPS

The Glorious Pipe Organ and Its American Masters

Another landmark celebrates its 25th anniversary. In 1979 when we installed Opus 78 at House of Hope Presbyterian Church in St. Paul, Minnesota, it was the largest organ that C.B. Fisk had built to that date. With four manuals and sixty-

three stops, it remained the largest until we completed Opus 120 for the Cathedral in Lausanne last year. Right from the first an ambitious program of concerts and workshops was begun under the direction of Nancy Lancaster, Minister of Music, and the musical events at House of Hope continue to play a key role in the life of the church.

Opus 84 at Mount Holyoke College celebrates its 20th anniversary. This Italianate instrument in the gallery of Abbey Chapel continues to enrich the lives of the students and community with a varied program of choral performances and organ recitals.

Edward Jones, who had served as Interim Organist at Harvard University's Memorial Church, our Opus 46, has been appointed University Organist and Choirmaster, and Curator of the University organs. Harry Lyn Huff has been named Assistant Organist and Choirmaster. Congratulations to Erica Johnson, former Organ Scholar at Harvard and now a doctoral candidate at Eastman. This fall she was awarded the International Arp Schnitger Society Prize and was named Organ Scholar by the Westfield Center. Erica led five of our organbuilders on a study tour of instruments in Niedersachsen and Ostfriesland last spring.

Two of our organbuilders have recently given lectures. Nami Hamada spoke at Ferris University in Yokohama where she had assisted the Brombaugh team with a recent installation. She described how an organ is designed and constructed, how it is played, and how the pipes speak, to a fascinated audience of adults and children. And in October Greg Bover gave a well-received lecture to the Friends of Switzerland at the

Harvard Club in Boston, describing the construction of Opus 120 for the Cathedral in Lausanne.

I have just returned from Yokohama where I was thrilled to see and hear our Opus 110 at Minato Mirai Hall for the very first time.



PROFILE: DIANE BEVINS

Tn 1992 when Diane Bevins interviewed for her position as bookkeeper at our shop, she confessed that she had asked for a filing cabinet for her twelfth birthday! It was a revelation sweet to our ears...we knew we had "a live one." A woman of prodigious organizational skills, Diane proceeded to take on her work with a keen attendance to the books, while administering a 401K Plan which she originated, managing our tool accounts, and keeping a sharp, egalitarian eye on the company benefits. She is a strong advocate for our shop in both the public and personal domains.

Just after Diane's arrival at the workshop, she traveled with us to Dallas for the inauguration of Opus 100 at the Meyerson Symphony Center. Her sociability was fully in evidence as we joined in the festivities there, touring the environs, and enjoying the

hospitality of our Texas friends. Informally, Diane might be called our "Recreational Director." She has organized outings to historic buildings in the area, initiated CPR and First Aid workshops for staff, arranged after-hours boating trips, ping-pong and bowling events, shop picnics and parties. Most famous, however, are her 'Wednesday Lunches' which serve as a kind of shop forum while we sample takeout foods from the local eateries, salted with current events and peppered with hilarity. At Open Houses, Diane can be found presiding over a table of chowder or pulled pork, welcoming friends and clients who have come to see the newest instrument.

Before making her move to the Fisk shop, Diane worked as a private secretary, assisting her clients with appointments and personal care and often arranging trips to the Museum of Fine Arts or the Boston Symphony. Her ability to foresee difficulties and her generosity in solving problems for others made her the ideal assistant and won her high praise and deep affection. Civic-minded, she held an elected office as a Trustee of the Library in her native town of Essex for twelve years, overseeing the budget and managing large and small projects, as well as the annual Pie Fest!

Since becoming a mother, Diane's hours here are fewer, but no less key to the goings on in our shop. Living near one of Gloucester's beautiful reservoirs with her husband, Jonathan and children Sam, 7, and Katie, 3, Diane is an avid gardener whose

flowers are of great interest to Cape Ann birds. Jonathan's mechanical expertise keeps a number of our cars on the road, and he captains the family boat (often with some of us in tow). They are both devoted parents. Diane volunteers at her children's schools, helping youngsters develop their learning skills with the mastery of a natural teacher.

The Fisk family would not be the same without the caring, bravura energies of Diane Bevins. She's a force of nature in our midst, and a champion for us all.
